### Training & Events

Training Programme on "Village Poverty Reduction Plan" (VPRP) held in South West Khasi Hills District, Meghalaya

A 3-day" Village Poverty Reduction Plan" (VPRP) training programme was held at Sngap Syiem Hall, Mawkyrwat of the South West Khasi Hills district from 6-8th October 2022. The programme was coordinated by Shri. Nicholas Rynjah, Faculty SIRD, and resource persons for the programme were:

A total of 34 participants from among SHGs, Village Organizations (VOs), and Community Resource persons attended the programme.



#### **Objectives of the VPRP programme were:**

- To orient participants on the steps components and aspects of the VPRP in the GPDP-VLDP planning process and the linkage with sustainable development goals (SDG).
- Inform participants on the concept of Village Organization (VO) seeding, livelihood plan activities, prioritization and consolidation of village-level plans in VPRP.





#### The outcome of the VPRP training:

- Participants have expressed clarity on the concept of VPRP and its components.
- Participants have been able to identify the different livelihood schemes of the departments of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Department.
- The experience sharing and hands-on practice of Entitlement Plan, Livelihood Plan, Public Goods Services and Resource Development Plan (PGSRD) and Social Development Plan have enabled the participants to list out the planning components of VPRP and how to integrate the practice for Plan consolidation and prioritization at the Village Organization (VO) level.
